AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made this Tuesday, 18-02-2025

BETWEEN

The **ST. PIOUS X DEGREE & PG COLLEGE FOR WOMEN (AUTONOMOUS)**, Snehapuri Colony, Nacharam, Hyderabad herein represented by the undersigned authorized representative (hereinafter referred to as the college, which expression shall unless repugnant to the subject or context thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the **FIRST PART**;

and

Asha Society, an NGO incorporated under Andhra Pradesh Societies Registration Act 2001, having its registered office at #23-525, Opp. RTC Bus Stand, Palnad Road, Vinukonda, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh-522647 (hereinafter referred to as "Service Provider" which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof include its successors and permitted assigns) of the **OTHER PART**;



WHEREAS:

1. The College is situated at the heart of the city
2. The College is having 31 years of establishment legacy
3. The College is established to service the society through education.
4. The Service Provider is an NGO and a strategic knowledge partner built to address growing challenges in the education and training domain, whose key focus is to enable training and allied activities by providing training and allied services
5. The Service Provider is an authorized partner to implement skill development programs enabled by the Ministry of Skill Development which will allow the establishments to enable skill development initiatives for the students
6. The College has approached the Service Provider to be an execution partner for PG Internships program.
7. The Service Provider has agreed to provide the Services to the establishment.


NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and for such valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency whereof is hereby acknowledged by the Parties, it is hereby agreed by the Parties as follows:

1. Appointment:

- a. The College agrees to engage Service Provider on an exclusive basis to provide the Services and Service Provider hereby accepts the appointment on the terms and conditions as set out in this Agreement. Services shall mean those services which are provided by the Service Provider as enumerated in Appendix A.
- b. The date on which this Agreement comes into effect and other relevant terms and conditions are set out in the Appendix A to this Agreement.
- c. In the event of conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the Appendices, the terms and conditions set out in the Appendices shall prevail over the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement.
- d. The Service Provider will be solely and completely responsible to ensure that it provides the Services in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and the Appendix A.

2. Service Provider's Obligations:

- a. Service Provider shall during the Term, provide Services as set out in Appendix A.
- b. Service Provider unconditionally undertakes and warrants that Service Provider has at its own cost, shall fully comply with all applicable central, state and local laws, regulations and local government orders pertaining to the performance of the Services, and that it has obtained all necessary consents and permits, licenses and approvals, relating to performance of Services and all its obligations in terms of this Agreement.
- c. Service Provider shall comply with other reasonable ancillary requirements, if any, communicated to it by the authorized representative of the college from time to time for performance and delivery of the Services.
- d. The Service Provider shall promptly address all complaints and observations made by the college in respect of the Services and ensure that the Services delivered by it adhere to the specifications as outlined in this Agreement.



- e. The Service Provider shall depute a number of personnel (virtually) as may be required for the rendering of the Services and will be suitably qualified and experienced.
- f. Service Provider shall deploy its own employees for rendering Services. It is clarified that there shall not subsist any employer – employee relationship either between the College and the Service Provider or the workmen/ employees employed and deployed by the Service Provider. Service Provider shall be SOLELY responsible for appointment, payment of wages, compliance with all statutory formalities relating to the employees employed and deployed by it including supervision, manner and mode of working, the manner in which the work should be done, the control of the workman, the payment of salary and all types of disciplinary action.
- g. Service Provider shall perform all administrative duties relating to the fulfillment of the Services by its employees or personnel, including, but not limited to, maintaining personnel records, processing payroll and withholding applicable taxes.

3. Compensation:

- a. Both Parties understand and agree that there will be a revenue share/compensation of:
 - Rs.2000.00 per student per year (in INR) to the college to get access to the required infrastructure. This shall be released to the college post completing the training course.

All Services will be provided as defined further in the Scope of Work, and all compensation will be paid directly by the Service Provider to the College. The College agrees that this compensation will be adequate and full and final compensation for the provision of the Services under the terms of this Agreement.

- b. Parties shall bear such all taxes as such Party is legally required to bear, including but not limited to any personal income taxes applicable to such Party.

4. Confidentiality:

- a. Service Provider agrees and binds itself and its personnel deployed for the college, not to reproduce, copy, divulge, or disclose to any person, party or entity without the prior written approval of the college, any confidential information, whether marked so or not, which Service Provider and/ or its personnel may have acquired or which were received, gathered, were made known or disclosed to it by the college in the course of performance or by reason of or as a result of this Agreement. Service provider shall take precautions to prevent any such use or disclosure by any of its personnel. This obligation shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

5. Compliance:

Service Provider undertakes that:

- a. It shall, at all times, comply with the terms of Annexure A relating to Code of Conduct.
- b. It shall, at all times, during the provision of Services under this Agreement, not incorporate any material into the Work Products (as defined hereunder) which may be the intellectual property of a third party without express authorization from the third party along with knowledge of the college that this material is being incorporated. Any license agreement which would need to be incorporated for incorporation of this material would need to be executed by the Service Provider.

6. Intellectual and Physical Property:

- a. Any materials, ideas, concepts or know-how (including all work notes) developed, provided or produced by the Service Provider, its employees or any subcontractors, in connection with the provision of Services ("Work Product") shall be the exclusive property of the Service Provider. Service Provider is free to use the Work Product in whatever way it requires, including but not restricted to providing same or similar services to other clients. At any point in time, during the subsistence of the Agreement or post the termination or expiry, whichever is earlier, the college will not have any claim over the Work Product whatsoever. The college recognizes the Service Provider to be the absolute and sole owner of the Work Product.

7. Indemnity:

- a. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable laws, both Parties agree to indemnify and undertake to keep indemnified and hold harmless each other, their respective directors, officers, employees, agents and representatives (the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all costs, expenses, charges, losses, claims, damages, liabilities, demands, actions, suits, proceedings or investigations, paid, suffered or incurred by or made or instituted by or against the indemnified parties, arising out of or resulting from (i) breach by either Party, its agents, employees, representatives or subcontractors, of any representation, warranty, undertaking or covenant provided by it in this Agreement; (ii) non-compliance by either Party or its agents, employees, representatives or subcontractors ;

8. Termination:

- a. *Termination for Convenience:* Both Parties may terminate this agreement or a portion of the Services at any time upon giving sixty (60) days written notice to the other Party.
- b. *Termination for Default:*
 1. The College may, by written notice, immediately terminate this agreement in whole or in part if Service Provider: (i) fails, for reasons other than an excused delay, to perform the Services adequately and within the time specified; (ii) breaches any material term, representation, warranty, covenant or condition of this Agreement and fails to cure such breach within fourteen (14) working days after intimation from the college, (iii) becomes insolvent or makes any assignment for the benefit of its creditors, or has a petition for winding-up filed against it, and such petition is not dismissed within sixty (60) days of filing, or has a trustee, administrator or receiver appointed for looking after its business or assets.
 2. Service Provider may, by written notice, immediately terminate this agreement in whole or in part if the College: (i) breaches any material term, representation, warranty, covenant or condition of this Agreement and fails to cure such breach within fourteen (14) working days after intimation from Service Provider, (ii) becomes insolvent or makes any assignment for the benefit of its creditors, or has a petition for winding-up filed against it, and such petition is not dismissed within sixty (60) days of filing, or has a trustee, administrator or receiver appointed for looking after its business or assets.
- c. Effect of Termination: the college and Service Provider shall return and shall ensure that their respective personnel return all the Confidential Information within thirty (30) days of termination of the Agreement.



9. General:

- a) The Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to its subject matter and may only be modified by a written document signed by duly authorized representatives of both Parties.
- b) If any provision of the Agreement is held by any court or other competent authority to be void or unenforceable in whole or part, the Agreement will continue to be valid as to its other provisions.
- c) Neither the college nor Service Provider shall be liable for failure to perform the obligations described in the Agreement if such failure is due to fire, flood, strikes, work stoppages, accidents, wars, riots, insurrections, governmental actions, acts of God, or any other cause that is beyond the parties' control.
- d) Neither Party shall be liable for any special, incidental, indirect, speculative, consequential, punitive or exemplary damages, whether arising from or as a result of breach of this Agreement or otherwise arising from provision of any services under this Agreement.
- e) No failure, delay or omission on the part of any Party in exercising any right, power or privilege under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of it, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any such right, power or privilege preclude any other or further exercise of it or the exercise of any other right, power or privilege.
- f) Any notice hereunder may be given by either Party to the other Party by leaving the same at the registered/ principal office of the other Party or by sending the same by registered post A.D. to the other Party at its registered/ principal office.
- g) All previous agreements and all other understandings on the subject matter contained herein shall be treated as canceled and terminated and this Agreement shall be sole Agreement governing the subject matter hereunder.

AND

b. **NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF SECURITIES MARKETS (NISM)**, established by Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) a market regulator, a Public Trust registered under the provisions of Bombay Public Trusts, Act 1950, having its registered office at 5th floor, NCL Co-operative Society, Plot No. C-6, E-Block, Bandra – Kurla Complex, Bandra (East) Mumbai-400051., hereinafter for the sake of brevity referred to as “**NISM**” (which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof shall mean and include its successor or successors, administrators and assigns) PARTY OF THE OTHER PART;

WHEREAS, the **St. Pious College** and the **NISM** shall be collectively referred to as the “Parties” and individually as “Party”

Objective of this letter of Understanding.

NISM is an institution established by Securities and Exchange Board of India with the objective of capacity building in the securities market. Securities market is growing industry where there are ample opportunities of employment and self-employment. The students who wish to pursue their career in the financial market would largely benefit if they study securities market subjects. Therefore, the objective of this letter of understanding is to train the students about the securities markets subjects and help them to get the NISM certificates which will enhance their knowledge and employability.

Terms of Understanding:

This letter of understanding between NISM and St. Pious College is to facilitate to conduct following activities with based on the terms and conditions as mutually agreed:

1. NISM will offer its certification and e-learning programs as regular Certification Examination / Skill Oriented Courses/Credit Courses for the students partnering institute/college.
2. The courses offered, fees for the courses and the reimbursement of cost, if any, will be as per the Annexure. The enrolments for certification Examination are subject to the eligibility of the students as mentioned in the Annexure. Please note that one of the essential requirement is to have a Permanent Account Number (PAN) issued by the Income Tax Department.
3. For enabling the faculty of the partnering institute/college to teach the NISM courses, NISM will provide following input to the faculty:
 - a) Sessions outline with learning objectives
 - b) Power Point Presentations with notes
 - c) Work Books
 - d) Assessment tools
 - e) Interactive doubt solving sessions with experts from NISM
4. NISM will create a Portal or collaborate with a business and employment-focused social media platform to bring recruiters to the partner institution to offer placement support to the students passing NISM certifications. NISM doesn't guarantee placement to the students in any manner.
5. The partnering institute/college is required to have a basic minimum infrastructure like Computer Lab of at least 30 computers for conducting the NISM Certification Examination for its students. NISM would allow to set up a test center for the students of the institution after fulfilment of requirements in accordance with the guidelines outlined by NISM.
6. NISM periodically conduct online Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) for the benefit of the faculty of partnering institute/college to enable them to understand the securities markets concepts and then teaching to their students. Such programs can also be conducted at NISM campus or at Regional Centers depending upon the requirements of the partnering institute/college. The cost of organizing Faculty Development Programs will be borne by


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NISM. However in case of offline FDPs any travel and accommodation costs for the faculty members of the partner institute shall be borne by the respective institute.

7. The examination will be conducted on mutually agreed dates and partnering institute/college should enroll minimum 30 students at PG level and/or minimum 50 at UG level for each certification exam.
8. The partnering institute/college shall appoint an invigilator who should be at least Assistant Professor and needs to share his/her profile with NISM. NISM will give basic training to the invigilator and the IT support staff on conducting the exam smoothly.
9. NISM will pay at the end of every academic year to the Institution towards their infrastructure utilization an amount of Rs.300/- (Rupees Three Hundred only) per enrolment if **150 or less** certification exams conducted in a year. If the number of certification exam conducted in a year **exceeds 150**, then NISM will reimburse an amount of Rs.450/- (Rupees Four Hundred Fifty only) per enrolment in that year.
10. The cost of certification fees may undergo changes depending upon NISM's policy at any point of time.
11. NISM will offer its own e-learning program at a flat 50% concession to the students of partnering institutions provided minimum 10 students enroll for each e-learning program.
12. A single point of contact/ dedicated coordinator shall be assigned by the partnering institute/college for a smooth functioning of the collaboration.
13. Any other areas of collaboration as may be mutually decided by and between the parties.

General Terms:

14. This arrangement shall be effective from the date mentioned herein above and will be valid for a period of three years unless terminated earlier by either Party as provided herein below. This may be extended by mutual agreement on year to year basis.
15. Either Party may terminate this arrangement at any time, for any reason and without incurring any additional liability, by giving written notice to other party at least sixty (60) days in advance.
16. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, in the event of termination, both the Parties will comply with their respective obligations w.r.t. fee payments, settlements of any commercial

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

charges etc., provided however, no fresh commitments to stakeholders shall be made during the period of termination notice.

17. And also, confidentiality of the information shared during the collaboration must be maintain by the parties in the best interest of each other.
18. In the event of any dispute or difference arising out of or in connection with this understanding, the parties shall first use their best efforts to settle such disputes amicably, failing which shall be finally settled under the Arbitration and Conciliation Act of 1996, by a sole arbitrator mutually acceptable to both the parties, and the same will be held in Mumbai and conducted in English Language. The Parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts in Mumbai, India in connection with any dispute arising out of or in connection with this Understanding.



It is Autonomous Institution affiliated to Osmania University & recognized by UGC under 2f and 12 (B). The College was established in 1993 with a group of 90 students and now the strength is augmented to 2500. Choice based credit system (CBCS) pattern is being introduced in 2016-2017. - D. The Parties are now desirous of entering into this Agreement to set out and record the terms and conditions under which the Parties will collaborate with each other in relation to the Purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS UNDER:

1. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

- 1.1 The Parties are desirous to collaborate and work together for developing a strategic relationship between them for the Purpose as more particularly set out in **Annexure A** to this Agreement
- 1.2 The detailed roles and responsibilities of each Party is provided in **Annexure B** to this Agreement.
- 1.3 Each Party will nominate a Single Point of Contact ("**SPOC**") to coordinate on all matters in relation to the Purpose of this Agreement.
- 1.4 The Parties agree and understand that if at any time in the future, the Parties intend to extend the scope of this Agreement which is beyond that has been expressly set forth herein ("**Additional Scope**"), the Parties may enter into separate Statement of Service ("**SOS**") in pursuance of the Additional Scope that details the delivery and rendering of services agreed between NSE Academy and the Client, which will cover the exact scope, the commercial terms, the roles and responsibilities of the respective Parties to the SOS and the methodology for rendering such Additional Scope (to the extent applicable and relevant). For avoidance of doubt, it is hereby clarified that SOS means a statement in the format provided in **Annexure C** separately prepared, approved and signed by both



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Parties in accordance with this Agreement specifying the Additional Scope of services to be performed, the time and manner of performance including milestones, schedules, the tasks to be accomplished, technical specifications, implementation and testing, warranty, fees and default details, the purposes to be achieved by the deliverables under the Additional Scope, and such other details as may be mutually agreed between the Parties from time to time.

2. PAYMENT TERMS

The Parties hereby agree and confirm to the payment terms as stipulated in **Annexure A** to this Agreement.

3. CONFIDENTIALITY

3.1 The Parties agree to keep all information arising from or pursuant to, or in the course of performance of the terms of this Agreement, secret and confidential (hereinafter referred to as "**Confidential Information**") and not to disclose such Confidential Information or to permit such Confidential Information to be disclosed, in writing, or electronically, which the receiving Party may have access to during the course of this Agreement, to any third party except with the prior written consent of the Party to whom the Confidential Information belongs. The obligations of maintaining confidentiality will apply during the validity of the Agreement as well as up to 3 (three) years after the expiration or termination of the Agreement, as the case may be. Each Party shall define its Confidential Information, prior to the signing of the Agreement. In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, 'Confidential Information' shall mean and include trade secrets, customer relationships, customer data, business methods, business processes, business techniques, business plans, data, graphs, charts, sound recordings, pictorial representations, inventions, details of systems and technology, prototypes, samples, trade secrets, finances, operations, methods and/or other information and material of any nature and in any form relating to the past, present or future business activities of the potential vendors, whether disclosed in writing, orally, or electronically, which the receiving Party may have access to during the course of this Agreement.

3.2 The obligation of confidentiality shall not apply to any Confidential Information that the other Party can demonstrate that:

- (a) at the time of disclosure was generally available to the public;
- (b) after disclosure, becomes generally available to the public without breach of this Agreement by the other Party;
- (c) disclosure is required under applicable laws or governmental regulations or for judicial process mandated by a court of law, provided a prior notice is given to the other Party to the extent permissible under applicable laws.

3.3. The receiving Party may not use any information obtained from the other Party for any purpose other than the Purpose outlined in the request without the prior written consent of the other Party. No disclosure of Confidential Information shall be made by the receiving Party to any third party without the prior consent of the disclosing Party, except to any third party having a legal right or duty to obtain or require such Confidential Information in accordance with the prevailing laws in the respective country of the receiving Party. In the event of such a disclosure, the receiving Party shall advise the



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disclosing Party thereof prior to disclosure, if possible, and shall further, to the extent that it is lawfully able to, take such steps to limit the extent of the disclosure; provide the disclosing Party a reasonable opportunity to intervene in the proceedings; and comply with the disclosing Party's reasonable requests as to the manner and terms of any such disclosure.

- 3.4 Following the termination of this Agreement, each Party will destroy or return to the other Party on demand any document supplied to it (including any notes, analysis or memorandum prepared by it) containing Confidential Information and any copy which may have been made and take reasonable steps to expunge all Confidential Information from any computer, word processor or other device containing Confidential Information. Any destruction of Confidential Information by a Party will be certified in writing to the other Party by an authorized officer supervising it. The undertakings in this clause shall not apply to Confidential Information which a Party must retain under any applicable law, rule or regulation.


4. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

Each Party represents and warrants to the other that:

- (a) it has the full power and absolute authority to enter into, execute and deliver this Agreement and to perform its obligations and the transactions contemplated hereby and, it is duly incorporated or organised and validly existing under the laws of the jurisdiction of its incorporation or organisation.
- (b) the execution and delivery of this Agreement and the performance by it of the transactions contemplated hereby have been duly authorised by all necessary corporate or other action of such Party.
- (c) the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement does not constitute a breach of its charter documents or, any agreement, arrangement or understanding, oral or written, entered into by it with any third party;
- (d) the execution, delivery and performance by it of this Agreement does not violate any statute, law, regulation, rule, order, decree, injunction or other restriction of any governmental entity, court or tribunal to which it is subject;
- (e) it has obtained all necessary approvals, consents, sanctions or authorizations required to enter into and perform this Agreement and no other approvals, consents, sanctions or authorizations of any regulatory authority or any other person are required to be obtained by it for the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement;
- (f) other than in the normal course of business, there is no pending or threatened litigation or other proceeding by any third party challenging the validity or propriety of, or otherwise relating to or involving this Agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby preventing it from entering into this Agreement or performing its obligations under and in accordance with this Agreement; and
- (g) assuming the due authorization, execution and delivery hereof by the other Party, this Agreement constitutes the legal, valid and binding obligation of such Party, enforceable



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against such Party in accordance with its terms, except as such enforceability may be limited by applicable bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, moratorium or similar laws affecting creditors' rights generally.

4.1 The Client warrants that it shall not use or access the LMS for any other purpose other than as provided under this Agreement. The Client shall not commercially exploit the LMS in any manner or provide any unauthorized access to anyone without written permission from the NSE Academy.

4.2 Both the Parties warrant that the content does not include any material that is pornographic, profane, obscene, abusive, harassing, threatening, libellous, defamatory, fraudulent, misleading, illegal, harassing, abusive, threatening, harmful, obscene, profane, sexually orientated, racially offensive directed at private individuals or creates a genuine risk of physical injury or property damage, credibly threatens people or public safety, or organizes or encourages harm.

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

5.1 The Intellectual Property Rights of the respective Parties shall continue to remain with them and be their exclusive and absolute property. For avoidance of doubt, it is hereby clarified that nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as assignment/transfer/license of Intellectual Property Rights of any Party to the other in any manner or for any reason whatsoever. In addition, the Parties agree and confirm that they will not acquire any right, title, or interest in the other Party's Intellectual Property Rights owned or developed by the other Party or licensed by the other Party from third party vendors.

For the purpose of this Clause, "Intellectual Property Rights" mean and include (a) all rights under all patents and patent applications, copyright laws (or all rights accruing by virtue of copyright treaties and conventions), including, but not limited to, all renewals, extensions, reversions or restorations of copyrights now or hereafter provided by law and all rights to make applications for and obtain copyright registrations therefore and recordation's thereof; (b) all rights to and under new and useful inventions, discoveries, designs, technology and art and all other patentable subject matter, including, but not limited to, all improvements thereof and all know-how related thereto, and all applications for and the right to make applications for patents, all patents that issue there from and all reissues, extensions, renewals, divisional applications and continuations (including continuations-in-part) thereof; (c) all trade secrets; (d) all trademarks, service marks and Internet domain names and the like throughout the world; and (e) all other intellectual and industrial property and proprietary rights throughout the world not otherwise included in the foregoing, including, without limitation, all techniques, methodologies and concepts and trade dress.

Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary herein or any other document, the Parties understand that NSE Academy may develop, create and prepare new products/modules/courses/content/material ("Product"), which may contain/embed the courses/materials/content of the Client, on such terms and conditions as may be mutually decided between the Parties in writing. For avoidance of doubt, it is hereby clarified that the Client shall continue to retain all rights, titles and interest (including intellectual property rights) to its Content



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which is embedded in the Product, however, all intellectual property rights pertaining to such Product shall vest with NAL only.

However, it is clarified that nothing in this Clause shall have an impact on the pre-existing Intellectual Property Rights of the respective Parties.

5.2 The Client agrees that performance of their obligations under this Agreement shall not at any time infringe any copyright, patent, trade secret or other property or intellectual property rights of any third party in any manner whatsoever.

5.3 If the Client is required to use the logos and/or banners of NSE Academy for the purposes of this Agreement, NSE Academy may, in its sole discretion, grant a limited, non-exclusive, non-assignable, revocable and non-transferable permission to the Client to use such logos and/or banners for the purposes of this Agreement. In this regard, the Client shall ensure that such usage by it is strictly for the purposes of the Agreement and is subject to brand guidelines of NSE Academy, as may be provided by NSE Academy to the Client. Further, the Client agrees and understands that the permission to use any logos and/or banners of NSE Academy, as per this Clause, does not convey/assign/transfer any proprietary interest /ownership/right in such logos and/or banners. The Client shall immediately cease to use such logos and/or banners of NSE Academy upon termination and/or expiration of the Agreement (as the case may be) or as per the requirements of NSE Academy.

6. INDEMNITY AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY


6.1 Client shall defend, indemnify and hold NSE Academy harmless against and in respect of any and all claims, damages, losses, liabilities, costs, expenses (including attorney fee) as a result of and/or arising out of material/wilful breach, gross negligence, misrepresentation, wilful misconduct, breach of Confidential Information, breach of Data and/or of any terms of the Agreement and/or to the extent that any claim is made by a third party including but not limited to claim in relation to infringement of Intellectual Property Rights. In addition, the Client agrees to defend, indemnify and hold NSE Academy harmless against and in respect of any and all claims, damages, losses, liabilities, costs, expenses arising out of any action or proceeding brought against/initiated against NSE Academy by any Participant due to the Client's breach of its obligations under this Agreement and/or due to any fault/act/omission which is solely and directly attributable to the Client. This clause shall survive post termination of this Agreement.

6.2 In no event shall either Party or any of their officers, directors, employees, agents, independent contractors, affiliates and shareholders be liable for any indirect, consequential or special damages suffered by the other Party under this agreement.

6.3 Except in cases of gross negligence, misrepresentation, wilful misconduct, wilful default, fraud and/or infringement of Intellectual Property Rights, breach of confidentiality obligations, breach of Data Protection Legislation the total liability of NSE Academy under this agreement, in all cases shall be limited to NSE Academy's share of revenue generated, on an annual basis, under this.



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
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7. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 7.1 This Agreement shall come in effect from the Effective Date and shall remain valid and in force for a duration of 3 years unless terminated by either Party in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 7.2 This Agreement may be terminated by the either Party at any time by giving to the other Party not less than 60 days' written notice and on the expiry of the 60 days' notice this Agreement will terminate but without prejudice to any other rights and remedies that either Party may have against the other Party.
- 7.3 Without prejudice to any other rights and remedies it may have, either Party may terminate this Agreement immediately upon service of written notice upon the other Party to that effect if:
- (a) the defaulting Party commits any material breach of any of the terms of this Agreement and (if such breach is remediable) fails to remedy that breach within a period of 14 days after being notified in writing to do so.
 - (b) NSE Academy shall have option to terminate Agreement at any stage upon breach of any of obligations, covenants, Representations and Warranties by the Client as set forth herein and such breach is not cured within 30 (thirty) days after NSE Academy gives written notice regarding the said breach
 - (c) the defaulting party is the subject of a bankruptcy petition or order or a resolution passed for its winding up or has a petition presented to any court for its winding up or an application is made for an administration order, or any winding-up or administration order is made against it and such order is not set aside within a period of 60 (sixty) days from the date of such admission against the Client and/or;
 - (d) the defaulting party has a receiver, manager, administrator or administrative receiver appointed over all or any part of its undertaking, assets or income;
 - (e) the defaulting party has a freezing order made against it;
 - (f) any event occurs, or proceeding is taken, with respect to the defaulting party in any jurisdiction to which it is subject that has an effect equivalent or similar to any of the events mentioned in these clauses 7.3 (c), (d) and (e);
 - (g) the defaulting party suspends or ceases, or threatens to suspend or cease, to carry on all or a substantial part of the business.
 - (h) Any conflict of interest arises that cannot be managed, the terminating Party shall consult with the other Party prior to such termination;
 - (i) Either Party can terminate this Agreement immediately or by notice if: (i) there is a change of law, rule, regulation or professional standard, or circumstances arise that either Party reasonably believe would cause the relationship between the Parties to violate such law, rule, regulation or professional standard or would prejudice any Party's ability to comply with applicable independence requirements.



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- 7.4 Upon material breach arising from breach of data, infringement of Intellectual Property Rights, any non-compliance with or breach of the provisions of the Terms of Use of LMS and breach of confidentiality obligations of the terms of this Agreement by the Client.
- 7.5 In the event of expiration and/or termination of this Agreement, both of the Parties shall be responsible and liable to fulfill their respective obligations till the entire duration of any/all ongoing Program(s) if any, subscribed by each Participant enrolled for such Program under this Agreement is completed. For avoidance of doubt, it is hereby clarified that no new Participant shall be enrolled for the purposes of the Program after the notice of termination has been provided by either Party in accordance with this Clause.
- 7.6 The Client agrees and understands that upon the expiry of the Term of the Agreement or early termination of the Agreement (i) the grant of right to access and use the Product by the Client and the students will expire automatically and with immediate effect; and (ii) The Client and the students shall cease to use the Product and remove all information / details in its possession (including its website, if any) regarding the Product (including the intellectual property rights) on termination of the Agreement.
- 7.7 It is hereby clarified that, any termination of this Agreement, will not relieve the Parties of their obligations specified in this Agreement till the enrolled students complete their respective Program; provided the students clear their examinations or any other clearance matrix as may be mutually decided by the Parties from time to time.
- 7.8 In case of termination of this Agreement by the Client under this Clause, the training sessions or the contract value committed under this Agreement but not executed till the effective date of termination for succeeding batches shall be deemed to have been cancelled by the Client. For avoidance of doubt, it is hereby clarified that expiry or termination of this Agreement (whichever is earlier) will not prejudice any rights of the Parties that may have accrued prior thereto. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, it is hereby agreed that the Client shall however be liable to pay any amounts pending or due for the ongoing batches which shall not be prejudiced by such termination.
- 7.9 The provisions with respect to indemnification, limitation of liability, data protection, confidentiality, intellectual property rights, representations and warranties shall survive the termination and/or expiry of this Agreement.

8. CONSEQUENCES OF TERMINATION

On termination of this Agreement for any reason:

- a) upon request, each Party will promptly return to the other Party, or securely delete, all tangible embodiments of Confidential Information (as defined herein) of such Party in its possession, custody or control in accordance with Clause 3.4;
- b) The Client shall promptly invoice NAL for all obligations performed but not yet invoiced and payment for such undisputed, true and accurate invoices and such invoices shall be payable in accordance with the timelines mentioned in this Agreement.



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- c) Each party shall immediately cease to use any material, names and logos and other Intellectual Property Rights relating to the other Party; and
- d) the accrued rights and liabilities of either party (including any rights in relation to breaches of contract) shall not be affected.
- e) The Client shall be liable to pay any amounts pending or due for the Services performed up to the date of termination which shall not be prejudiced by such termination.

8.2 Any provision of this Agreement which expressly or by necessary implication is intended to have effect after expiry or termination of this Agreement shall continue to have such effect for the intended further period.

8.3 The Parties' obligations of confidentiality under this Agreement shall survive for the period of 3 (three) years from the date of termination of this Agreement, however it is terminated.

8.4 Termination of this Agreement shall be without prejudice to any rights that have accrued under this Agreement.

9. ACCESS TO LMS

9.1 NAL shall provide a complimentary, non-exclusive, non-transferable, non-assignable, revocable and limited right to the Participants to access and use LMS in accordance with this Clause 9. For avoidance of doubt, it is hereby clarified that the access to LMS shall be for a period of 3 years ("LMS Term").

9.2 The Client understands that access and use of the LMS is subject to acceptance of and compliance with the terms of use pertaining to the LMS, as may be framed, amended or modified by NSE Academy from time to time ("Terms of Use"). The said Terms of Use shall be uploaded and made available on NSE Academy's website from time to time.

9.3 NSE Academy reserves the right to suspend and/or terminate the access/right to use the LMS by the Client and/or the Participants without any prior notice, if the Client and/or Participant commit any breach of/violate any of the terms of this Agreement. It is hereby clarified that any unauthorized use of the Product or any fraudulent, abusive, or otherwise illegal activities will be considered as grounds for termination of access/right to use.

9.4 Upon the expiry of the LMS Term, the grant of right to access and use the LMS by the Participants will expire and cease with immediate effect.

9.5 Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary, NSE Academy expressly disclaims any and all warranties and conditions, including, but not limited to, any implied warranty or condition of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose and/or availability in relation to its online platform/portal (including LMS). NSE Academy does not represent, warrant or make any condition that its portals/platforms (including LMS) are free of inaccuracies, errors, bugs or interruptions, or are reliable, accurate or complete.



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For the purposes of this Agreement:

- (i) "LMS" refers to **learning management system** or **virtual learning environment (VLE)** which means and includes NSE Knowledge Hub and other software application for the administration, documentation, tracking, reporting, automation, and delivery of educational courses, training programs, materials or learning and development programs.
- (ii) "NSE Knowledge Hub" refers to an artificial learning and machine learning capable software available in mobile and web version that focuses on delivering personalized learner experience. It's advanced learning platform aggregates global digital content, assist in creation and authoring of content, manages curation of learning pathways and journeys and helps in customized learning for users. NSE Knowledge Hub other study materials, software exposure, question banks, e-learning materials, e-learning platform etc. published/owned/prepared/developed/designed/used/created by NSE Academy.

10. DATA PROTECTION

10.1 Both the Parties have complied with and shall continue to comply with all relevant requirements of the data protection legislations and regulations in India (including the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023, Information Technology Act, 2000 (as amended) and the rules framed thereunder) ("**Data Protection Legislations**"). Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, or any other document, Parties hereby agree, confirm and affirm that it shall not collect, process, store or use any data (personal or otherwise) pertaining to other Party/its employees/its activities, for any reason whatsoever, unless otherwise permitted by the other Party. If permitted, Parties agree that any collection, processing, store or use of data shall be in such form and manner as may be mutually agreed between the Parties (in writing) and shall strictly be in accordance with the applicable Data Protection Legislations.

10.2 The Parties mutually agree to maintain commercially reasonable administrative, physical, and technical safeguards for protection of the security, confidentiality of data and information of the Participants and any sensitive personal data belonging to either Party, its personnel, officers and trainers.

11. EXPENSES

Each Party shall bear its own costs and expenses with regard to any negotiations and/or activities that it may incur in connection with this Agreement, unless otherwise agreed separately in relation to an activity.

12. SUBCONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT

NAL may engage third party service providers, agents, contractors etc. for marketing and promotion related activities for the Purpose of this Agreement.

The Client shall not assign, sub-contract or delegate its rights or obligations under this Agreement to a third-party without the prior written consent of NSE Academy.

The events and activities arising out of this Agreement may be reviewed, as may be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties, from the perspective of the outputs and outcomes envisaged. The scope, venue, frequency, and duration of such reviews shall be discussed and mutually agreed upon by the Parties, from time to time.

18. AMENDMENT

This Agreement shall not be amended, modified, altered or changed in any way except in writing executed by both Parties.

19. QUALITY EVALUATION

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, NSE Academy reserves the right to record, audiotape, videotape the sessions for its internal resource library. It is hereby clarified that any videos, photographs, participant feedback etc. may be used by NSE Academy for its internal quality evaluation for promotional content (excluding any mass distributed promotional activity) or for web trailers or for

24. DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND GOVERNING LAW

3. Purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding:

This Non Financial Memorandum of Understanding between two parties as mentioned above will formalize the partnership between both the parties and defines the roles, responsibilities and details of the initiatives on the water conservation and waste management in the campus of the Second party.

- III. Co-ordinates with the designated representative of Second Party and execute the DPR.
- IV. Allocate funds for executing the complete or partial plans as per the situation on the ground and total requirements of the site. These funds will be within Rs 3 Lakh.
- V. Execute the work/ activities of DPR in the campus.
- VI. Develop a detailed monitoring plan/ Dashboard for presenting the progress of the project on the site, with the support for Second Party.
- VII. Provide advisory services on waste management of the campus and zero waste campus related efforts.
- VIII. Organize series of on-campus and off-campus learning events for students, parents of students and faculty members – which include workshops, meetings, planning events, data collection processes, visits to sites where good practices are already implemented, cleaning drives.
- IX. Conduct monitoring and review meetings along with Second Party.
- X. Document good practices in print and digital formats for showcasing in the social media platforms.

5. 2. Roles and Responsibilities of Second Party:

- I. Designate a senior faculty member/ Head of the Department/ any suitable team for coordination, communication and monitoring of this initiative.
- II. Support the First Party in conducting field surveys, data collection and development of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs).
- III. Share relevant data, maps, layout plans of the campus and on-going activities of the campus with First Party for enabling better planning
- IV. Deploy students/ faculty members/ others for learning events, practical sessions and other relevant field work related to planning, execution and monitoring of the water conservation and management efforts.
- V. Depute a person/ team for collection of water resource data from time to time, as per the time schedules suggested by First Party and ensure the process of updating the monitoring portal to create dash boards.
- VI. Allocate space (auditorium/ classrooms/ hostel rooms/ meeting rooms) for any learning events/ meetings/ workshops.
- VII. Allocate space for water conservation works within the campus
- VIII. Get any necessary permission from relevant authorities (government agencies or internal management committees or others) for taking up the water conservation and management related interventions within the campus.
- IX. Maintain the assets created during the project period, for the coming years, with own resources so that these assets perform well and serve the campus effectively in future.
- X. Organize/ facilitate workshops/ learning events for the students and their parents to improve the awareness on water conservation and promote actions outside the campus also, with the support of First Party.

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



7. Transparency
