
Speech on Child Labour: A compelling speech was delivered by a student speaker, shedding light on the causes, consequences, and current statistics of child labour. The speaker also spoke



The event successfully instilled a sense of environmental responsibility and emotional connection with nature among the youth. It also served as a platform for creative expression and leadership development.



Objective of the Activity: The Awareness Quiz on HIV/AIDS, which was open to all, aimed at

encouraging inclusive participation and broad-based sensitization among students. World AIDS


Day, observed annually on December 1st, signifies global solidarity, awareness, and collective

action against HIV/AIDS. The 2025 theme, "Overcoming Disruption, Transforming the AIDS

Response," emphasizes rebuilding and strengthening HIV prevention, diagnosis, and treatment

services that were disrupted due to global challenges such as the COVID-19 pandemic and persistent social inequalities. The theme calls for people-centered, evidence-based, and equitable healthcare systems to accelerate progress toward ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2030. In alignment with this global initiative, the objective of the activity was to assess and enhance students' awareness and understanding of HIV/AIDS, including its transmission, prevention strategies, diagnostic approaches, and treatment options, while dispelling common myths and misconceptions associated with the disease. Observing World AIDS Day through academic initiatives such as this quiz reinforced the importance of combating stigma and discrimination, ensuring universal access to prevention and treatment, and renewing institutional and individual commitment to achieving global health and sustainable development goals. Brief Report: The Department of Microbiology, in association with MBSI, India and ISR Wing – AYUR, National Service Scheme (NSS) Units I & II, organized an Awareness Quiz on HIV–AIDS. The quiz, open to all, was conducted on 1 December 2025 in observance of World AIDS Day. The initiative aimed to promote inclusive participation, enhance awareness about HIV/AIDS, dispel myths and misconceptions, and reinforce collective responsibility toward prevention, care, and stigma reduction. The Quiz comprised 25 multiple-choice questions covering key aspects such as the meaning of HIV and AIDS, modes of transmission, diagnostic tests, window period, antiretroviral therapy (ART), prevention strategies including PEP, myths and facts related to HIV, and community-level interventions. A total of 77 students participated enthusiastically. The overall performance indicated a high level of awareness, with an average score of 23.26 out of 25, a median score of 24, and a score range of 12–25. Most questions received over 90% correct responses, particularly those related to the definition of AIDS, the red ribbon symbol, World AIDS Day, HIV transmission myths, ART benefits, and immediate steps after possible exposure. This initiative created sensitization about the nuances of HIV among the academic fraternity and various stakeholders. Questions related to window period interpretation, viral load and transmission, HIV survival outside the body, and the absence of a complete cure for HIV showed comparatively lower correct responses, indicating specific areas where further reinforcement is required. Quiz Link: <https://forms.gle/eg2JkvFf7xbWjwRK9> Outcome of the Activity: • Students demonstrated a strong foundational understanding of HIV/AIDS, its transmission, diagnosis, and prevention. • The quiz effectively helped in dispelling common myths related to HIV infection. • Students gained clarity on the importance of early testing, ART adherence, and preventive measures such as PEP. • The activity reinforced the role of education and awareness in reducing stigma and promoting responsible health behavior. The results of the World AIDS Day Awareness Quiz clearly indicate a high level of general awareness among students regarding HIV/AIDS, reflecting the effectiveness of academic teaching and awareness initiatives undertaken by the department. While the majority of participants demonstrated excellent knowledge, the analysis also highlighted certain conceptual gaps that can be addressed through continued sensitization programmes, expert talks, and interactive learning activities. Overall, the quiz successfully fulfilled its objective of promoting informed understanding, responsible attitudes, and public health consciousness among students, thereby contributing meaningfully to World AIDS Day observance.





REPORT ON WORLD CANCER DAY 2026


