## 2. Highlights

### a) National Seminar

A two-day National Seminar on “Mission to Vision: Addressing the Issues & Challenges of India's \$5 Trillion Economy” was successfully organized by the Departments of Business Management and Social Sciences of St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women, with sponsorship from the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR). The event was held on 11th and 12th March 2025 and aimed to address critical themes related to the economic future of India, including Economic Prosperity and Sustainability, Human Resources, Holistic Growth & Development, Good Governance & Administration in both the Public and Private Sectors, as well as Research, Technology, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship Development.

### Inaugural Ceremony:

The seminar commenced with a warm welcome by **Rev. Sr. Dr. Velangini Kumari** Principal of St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women, to all participants and expressed her gratitude to the departments of Business Management and Social Sciences, as well as the student volunteers, for their contributions in organizing the seminar. The distinguished dignitaries, Dr.



Sudhakar Reddy, Head of the Department of Economics. Osmania University, and Prof. Parthasarathi, Dean of the Department of Business Administration graced the occasion.

**Dr. Sudhakar Reddy**, Chief Guest and Director at ICSSR-SRC, Osmania University, delivered an insightful address focused on the National Vision of Viksit Bharat 2047. He emphasized the role of social inclusivity in achieving global competitiveness, pointing out that the challenges faced in reaching this vision were the very issues the seminar intended to address.

### **Session 1: Economic Prosperity and Sustainability**

The first technical session, focusing on economic prosperity and sustainability, was inaugurated by **Dr. Tamma Koti Reddy**, Professor and Dean of ICFAI School of Social Sciences, IFHE. Dr. Reddy delivered the keynote address, emphasizing the need for balanced economic growth that integrates environmental sustainability, social inclusion, and economic stability.

### **Session 2: Human Resources, Holistic Growth, and Development**

The second technical session, chaired by **Dr. P. Swathi**, Head, Department of Psychology. Osmania University, explored the multifaceted aspects of human resource development. Dr. Swathi stressed the importance of organizing people, processes, and products effectively to enhance human capital. She also discussed the role of psychological capital, employee engagement, and the PERMA Model of Well-Being in HR development, highlighting the significance of emotional, intellectual, and spiritual intelligence.

### **Session 3: Good Governance & Administration in Public & Private Sectors**

The third technical session, focusing on governance and administration, was chaired by **Prof. Afroz Alam**, an expert in Governance and Public Administration. He provided an in-depth reflection on the characteristics of good governance within democratic structures and how these principles can be applied to improve both public and private sector administration.

### **Session 4: Research, Technology Development, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship**

The fourth technical session, led by **Dr. Satish Thalladi**, Head. Department of Journalism and Mass Communication. Osmania University, focused on the pivotal role of research, technology, and innovation in achieving India's \$5 trillion economy. Dr. Thalladi emphasized the importance of fostering a culture of innovation and supporting start-ups to drive economic growth.

Overall, this National Seminar provided valuable insights into the challenges and opportunities for India's Economic Transformation, encouraging collaboration between Academia, Industry, and Policymakers. 252 participants attended the seminar and 52 research papers were presented.



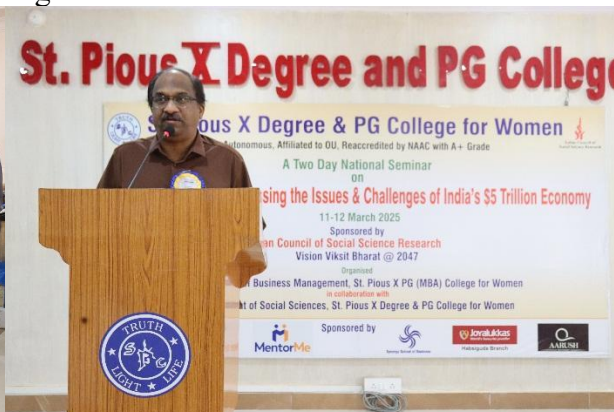

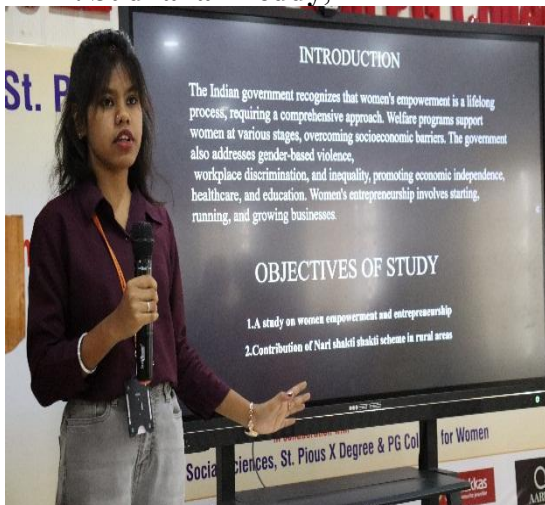

### c) Series of masterclasses on Intellectual Property rights (IPR)

- A week-long educational initiative titled "**IP Utsav**" was organized by Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) and Research Committee (IPR Cell) from **21st April to 26th April 2025** to promote awareness and understanding of **Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)**. The event featured a series of masterclasses, each focusing on a specific area of IPR. Participants from diverse academic and professional backgrounds enthusiastically engaged in the sessions aimed at fostering innovation and legal literacy around IP protection.

#### Day 1: 21st April – Inauguration of IP Utsav

The event commenced with the **Inaugural Ceremony**, marking the beginning of IP Utsav. Esteemed dignitaries, legal experts, and industry professionals graced the occasion. Keynote addresses highlighted the growing importance of IPR in the global knowledge economy, setting the tone for an insightful week ahead.

#### Day 2: 22nd April – “Discover More with Design Registrations”

The second day focused on **Design Registrations**, exploring their role in protecting the visual aesthetics of products. The speaker shed light on the legal framework governing design rights in India and shared practical case studies. Participants gained a clearer understanding of how design registration adds value and distinction in competitive markets.

#### Day 3: 23rd April – “Copy That! Copyrights Uncovered”

This session offered a deep dive into **copyrights**. The expert explained how creative works—such as literature, music, and software—are protected under copyright laws. Topics like fair use, infringement, and digital content rights were discussed in detail, generating lively interaction among attendees.

#### Day 4: 24th April – “Mark the Spot: Trademark Talk”

Day four highlighted the **Importance of Trademarks** in brand identity and consumer trust. The speaker walked the audience through trademark registration, enforcement, and global protection. Real-world trademark disputes and branding strategies were also examined to provide practical insights.

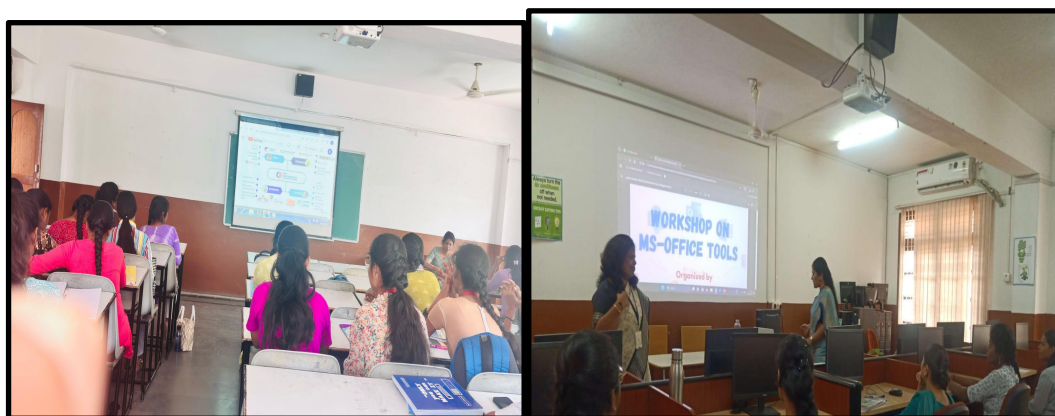
#### Day 5: 25th April – “Significance of IP Protection and Commercialization”

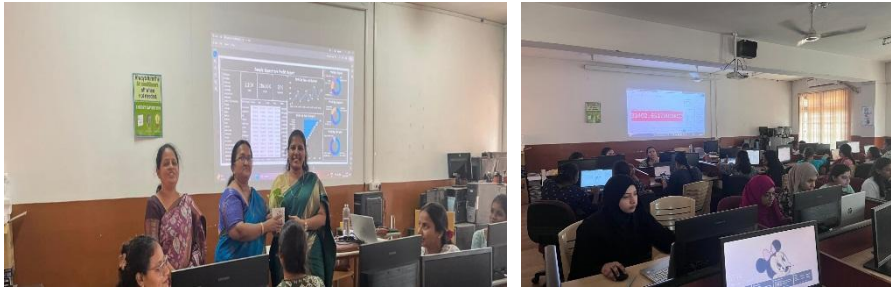
### **c) Workshop on Power BI**

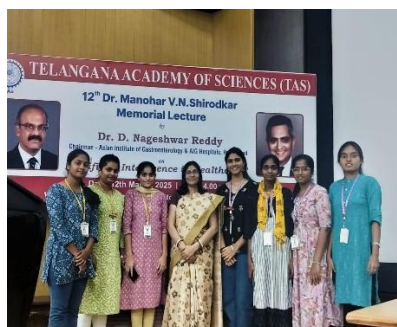

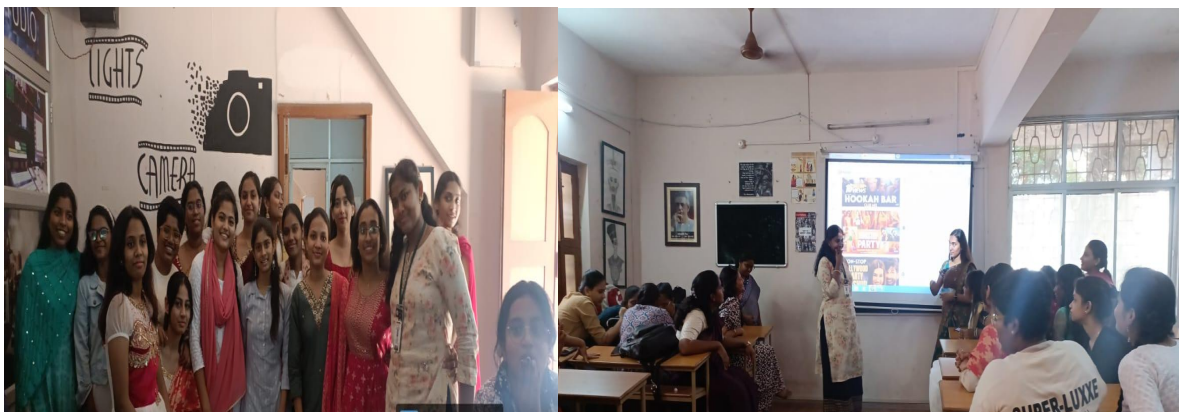
### Chatterbox Club

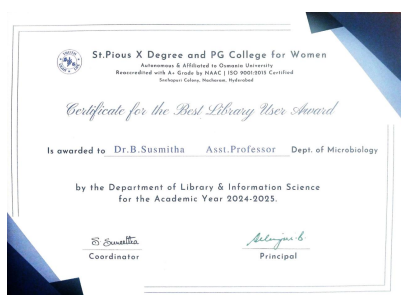
