1. BRIEF HISTORY

Introduction

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women is a Catholic Minority Institution established and administrated by the Society of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann, Hyderabad, under the article 30(1) according to the Constitution of India. It is recognized by UGC under 2(f) and 12(B) certificates and is affiliated to Osmania University. The College aims at preparing graduates to lead extraordinary lives in pursuit of truth and personal integrity. Students of all faiths are admitted without any discrimination of caste and creed. The College is committed to serve the poor, needy and socially backward. The College is provided with a hostel on the campus for outstation students.

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women had a humble beginning in 1993 with a small group of 90 students. Within a short span of time, it carved a niche as one of the best colleges in Osmania University for its academic standards. It is accredited by NAAC with grade 'A' in 2013 and Re-accredited with 'A+' grade in 2018. The Institution is conferred with Autonomous status by University Grants Commission on May 31, 2023. The serene campus is spread over 3 acres of land, with state of art laboratories, Snehitha Counselling Centre, Mass Communication studio, Language Lab, Psychology Lab, Spacious and well-ventilated ICT class rooms and staff rooms in two buildings. A large auditorium, modern conference hall, audio-visual room, gymnasium, playground and canteen are the additional facilities. The College is offering **23** graduate and **5** Post graduate programs. The College takes pride in possessing a team of **94** committed, dynamic, efficient and highly qualified teaching staff. The College imparts sound academic

knowledge promoting the spiritual and social values which help in the integrated growth of the students. The College promotes Universal brotherhood through prayer services, seminars and workshops. The secret of the success of the college is well-maintained discipline and high academic standard with research culture.

Our Management

The Congregation of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann (CSA) was founded in 1914 in Nalgonda District, Telangana by Rev.Fr. Silvio Pasquali PIME to spread the light of Christ through various charitable activities. The objectives of the Management are the culmination of the various qualities of its founder to eradicate poverty, social injustice, oppression, and ignorance among rural masses, which is the very mission of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann. 4.RULES & REGULATIONS

Every student of St. Pious X Degree & PG College is a unique gift of God, nurtured with love and wide opportunities for their total development. They are personally motivated at every level and guided to uphold the spirit of St. Pious X in their pursuit of acquiring knowledge. Truth, Purity of Life, Relationship and Interaction among the college community and outside the college are promoted by the Institution. Truth and Purity of life is the hallmark of St. Pious X College and is reflected in the character of the Piousians.

The students should behave politely and respectfully. They should abide by the rules and regulations stipulated by the college from time to time.

- The Working Schedule of the College is as follows:

The College functions from 9.10 am to 3.10 pm.

Prayer at 9:10am and a Lunch Break (12:50 pm – 1:30 pm).

- Subject wise attendance is taken every period. The students are expected to have a minimum of 75% attendance in each subject and in general. Those with less than 75% attendance are not eligible to appear for end semester Examinations.
- Students on leave should submit the leave letter to the class in-charge lecturer duly signed by parent and principal.
- Students should be regular, punctual to the classes, attend

seminars and other academic activities.

- The students are expected to safeguard the property of the college.
- It is the responsibility of the students to take care of their belongings. The college is not responsible for any loss of valuables like gold, mobile, money etc.
- The students are expected to carry their identity card all the time and they should be ready to produce it at any time when required by the college authorities.
- Any kind of demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the college or disrupts any activity in the college is forbidden.
- The student should make optimum use of the learning resources and other support services available in the institution.
- Permission for representing oneself in Extra-Curricular activities like sports, games, cultural festivals, NCC and NSS should be obtained in advance from Principal / Dean with a letter of request duly recommended by the staff member or the coordinator/the officer concerned.

- Ragging is totally prohibited in the campus.

5. ADMINISTRATION AND FACULTY

The St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women is owned and managed by the Catechist Sisters of St. Ann (CSA). The Governing Body (GB) of the College is constituted by the CSA. The GB President appoints the Correspondent and the Principal of the College. The Correspondent and the Principal make the appointments of staff with approval from the Governing Body and the Affiliating University (i.e. Osmania University) representatives. The major financial and administrative policies of the College are formulated by the GB and executed by the Finance and Planning Committees through the Correspondent. The Correspondent shall be responsible for supervising the maintenance of the accounts and properties of the College in accordance with the rules stipulated by the University, Government and Management.

The general administration, academics, Deans, IQAC and stakeholders are vested in the Principal. Under Graduate Courses (CBCS) -CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women follows **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** and semester pattern with respect to Teaching and Evaluation. The College has adopted the system of valuation based both on **Continuous Internal Assessment (C.I.A.)** and **Semester-End Examination (S.E.E)** Each Semester has Two Internal Examinations and one subject wise assessments (Total 3 C.I.A) along with one Semester End Examination (S.E.E) in the ratio of **30:70**. Marks in each subject is a part of a reliable and sustainable evaluation process.

Continuous Internal Assessments - CIA

- Two written internal tests of twenty marks each and the third test for 20 marks by way of Seminars/Quiz/Assignment etc. are conducted. The total marks obtained in the three tests are then scaled down to 30.
- A student can appeal to the course teacher or approach the head of the Department for any clarification, regarding evaluation, immediately after receiving the valued scripts.
- A student absent for any internal exams will lose the marks in the test.
- No retest or improvement is conducted for internal assessment, seminars and Project Work.
- Retest will be conducted only if a student is absent due to authorized participation in college programmes like sports, competition, NCC/NSS activities etc.

Semester End Examination - S.E.E.

- 75% of attendance is compulsory for all the students to appear the Semester End Examinations.
- Condonation up to 10% may be considered by the Principal on medical grounds / on a case to case basis.
- Passing minimum is 40% in S.E.E. and 40% in aggregate (marks in the end semester and internal examination put together) for Theory Courses and 50% for the Practical Courses.

Semester Backlog Examinations

- UG & PG theory and practical backlog examinations to be held in the even semester only.

- Semester backlog examinations can be taken only n+2 times for a subject under the same syllabus. Thereafter the student will have to repeat the examination under the revised syllabus, if the syllabus is revised.
- To be awarded I / II division for an undergraduate programme a student is required to pass all papers within the stipulated 6 semesters. The year and month of passing the exam is indicated in the consolidated memo of marks. Students who fail to clear all the subjects will be considered as backlog candidates. No division will be awarded.
- **There is no provision for an improvement exam.**
- **Instant Supplementary Exam:** Provision for Instant supplementary examination will be conducted to provide an immediate chance for the outgoing batch students to clear the last semester backlog papers.

Revaluation

Revaluation of answer scripts is applicable for all theory courses except practical subjects.

- Notification for revaluation will be released by examination branch on the day of results declaration
- The application for revaluation after the last date will not be entertained.
- Answer scripts are evaluated by two examiners independently
- If the average marks of two examiners do not differ by more than 10% from the original marks, the original marks will be retained
- If the average marks of the two examiners differ by more than 10% from the original marks then the original marks will be removed and the average marks of revaluation will

be taken into account and awarded to the candidate, and the revised results declared.

Malpractice:

- A student is guilty of malpractice if she is found attempting to copy, copying or in possession of incriminating material, any papers or writing on any part of the body. The decision of the Committee shall be the final.
- A committee comprising of the Principal, Controller of Examinations and the concerned Invigilator will investigate cases of malpractice along with the Grievance Committee.
- Parents of such students will be informed about the same and counselling is given to such students.
- In case of malpractice during continuous assessments, the student found guilty by the committee will be awarded zero marks in the concerned paper.
- In case semester-end examinations, if the student is found guilty of committing any malpractice, all the papers mentioned in the Hall ticket shall stand cancelled.

SGPA & CGPA:

As part of Choice-based Credit System (CBCS), Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) has been implemented from the academic year 2023- 24. As per the Osmania University grading system, the grade letter is a measure of a student's performance in a particular course (Paper). It is the conversion of the actual grades a student received for a course or paper. Grade letter of O, A, B, C, D, E, or F represents it.

Each Grade Letter has a range of grades. If a student misses an exam, the grade letter Ab is substituted in the memo for the grade letter. According to the grading system grades are given in a course or paper, and Grade Point gives each grade letter a certain amount of weight.

Class Rooms

Science Laboratories

The College emphasizes on practical training of the students. Laboratories are the essential resources of learning Science. All the science departments are well-equipped with latest and sophisticated instruments. These labs serve as potential centers for research and project works.

Mass Communication Studio

The Department of Mass Communication is well furnished with state of the art Production Studio, where the students are

Psychology Lab

The college library has also been subscribed to INFLIBNET- NLIST & DELNET databases for better research and academic pursuits.

3) Extension & Outreach Programmes

The Placement Cell organizes training programs from the second year onwards for undergraduate students which will be continued till their final year making them ready for Placement drives. Whenever campus placements are scheduled, parents are expected to pick up the ward if it gets delayed. Students who are interested in attending off-campus placements are instructed to inform the concerned placement officer prior and make necessary arrangements.

5) Pious Alumni Association

11. STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

- **Value Education:** Educating the youth with human values is the core objective of the Institution. Value Education classes are held every Saturday. - **Attendance:** The students are expected to be regular to the college and put in not less than 75% attendance as per university rules. A student who fails to fulfill this criterion shall not be permitted to appear for University Examinations. Month wise attendance percentage will be displayed on the

college notice board every month.

- A student absent to the college due to illness or any genuine reason, should submit the leave letter along with medical certificates to the Principal duly signed by the parent.
- **Preparatory Bridge Courses:** Preparatory Bridge Courses are conducted to bridge the gap in study skills of students from different backgrounds
 - Bridge course in English is conducted for vernacular students.
 - Special care is being extended to commerce students who come from Non-Commerce background. A short bridge course is offered to Non-Commerce students in Accounts and Basics of commerce
 - A 15 hrs. bridge course is offered in Chemistry to the students of B.Sc.
 - One week bridge course is offered for students with lack of computer knowledge to impart basic computer skills in them.
- **Continuous Academic Assessment and Evaluation:** Unit tests and Term examinations are conducted periodically to monitor students' academic performance and their Grades are sent to the parents through LMS. The Examination Committee plans for Internal Assessment Tests, Prefinal theory and practical examinations for all the students. Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation through assignments, projects, quiz, presentations, online test, JAM , open book models, book reviews, albums, Viva, Objective Type questions, Group discussion etc. keep the students always alert with their curriculum and regular to the classes.

- **Remedial program:** The remedial classes are given by the respective departments to the students who need more care and attention to improve their academic performance. These classes are conducted after the college hours. The parents and guardians are also requested to take notice of such classes and monitor their wards periodically.
- **Supportive Classes:** Classes on computer applications are conducted for students coming from Non-Computer background, after college hours to strengthen their computer skills.
- **Personality Development and Career Guidance:**
St. Pious X college aims at all-round development of the Piousians. Orientations, Seminars and Workshops are organized by the various departments by inviting eminent guest speakers as resource persons. Such programmes build confidence, attitude and aptitude in the students to face challenges in life.
- **Mock Viva and interviews:** Mock Viva is conducted by the concerned departments to inculcate an awareness and interest among the students to prepare and face real viva sessions effectively and face interviews successfully to excel in life.
- **Project Guidance:** To orient students towards research, projects are assigned to students to be carried out under the guidance of the faculty. The students are also encouraged to come up with innovative projects in various subjects through counseling given by the departmental faculties. They are boosted with internship and provided an opportunity to sign up with reputed companies for quality project reports.
- **Orientation Programmes:** Personality development programmes are provided in goal- setting, etiquette and grooming, positive thinking, self-confidence, ice-breaking,

case studies, aptitude tests, group discussions, oral and written communication skills aiming at tracing the students' hidden talents and refine their individual skills and requirements.

- **Field Trips:** Industrial and field trips create awareness and provide an experiential learning and understanding of the practical aspects of the industry.
- **Guest Lectures/Expert Talks:** The departments organize subject lectures by inviting eminent scholars and experts from various Institutions and industries, corporate sector, segments of various departments of Universities and other reputed organizations.
- **Skill Enhancement:** Unemployability is today a greater issue than unemployment. Only 10% of fresh graduates are actually employable with their academic performance, which means that they need to be supplemented with various other skills. Hence, the college Management train the UG & PG students in collaboration with the reputed agencies through workshops and certificate courses.
- Students present subject related and general topics in their respective classrooms under the guidance of the faculty to develop their interpersonal communication skills and thus enhance their overall personality. In addition, the students also improve their presentation skills through projects, posters, and power-point and paper presentations.
- **Employability Skill Training:** Students are trained in interpersonal skills, the art of communication, building up a confident personality with positive attitude and effective communication.

Life Skills play a very significant role in the present scenario. Keeping this in view, Soft skill training is offered

to the degree students which help them to communicate effectively, develop their personality and face interviews successfully.

LMS (Learning Management System):

The institution has an integrated Learning Management System (LMS) software to plan, implement, facilitate, assess, and monitor students learning. This LMS is designed and used for marking attendance, assigning work, content sharing, posting grades and sharing e- resources. Students can submit assignments, view content, check attendance and collaborate on forums. LMS is not only focused on online learning but also supports as a platform for fee payment and notification to parents through SMS alert.
